A/V Updates By Dave Meythaler

Patrick and I are collaborating on a project which replaces one of our AV PCs and implements improvements to how we do live streaming. The goal is to move away from using the camera for everything, having to point it at the platform screen to see video content, and instead switch the livestream directly between the camera and the computer which plays the videos. This change also has the benefit of supporting additional cameras in the future to eliminate seeing awkward camera movements while zooming or panning.

The expectation is it will take a few weeks to get new software running, configured and tested on the new PC. We will try to rollout the new capabilities in a way which avoids disruption, and there may be some unexpected glitches along the way since we are in uncharted waters.

One of the challenges is to find ways to simplify the operation of the new system since it will be different and a bit more complex than the way we currently are doing the livestream. We have some ideas on how to manage this, and may experiment with different things as we work out the details. The end result should be a noticeable improvement for our viewers and also the team behind the scenes.
